



Cost structure 2004







Development of freight transport volume




Freight transport structure 2004 by means of transport



Structure of goods transported in 2004 by groups




Railway stations for freight transport





Development of passenger transport volume




Passenger transport structure in 2004


Development of employment 1994-2004 (yearend)




Employees by age and sex



Employees by organisational units 2004









Age of freight wagons (state on 31 December 2004)




Age of conventional passenger coaches (state on 31 December 2004)



Age of passenger trainsets (state on 31 December 2004)




Age of locomotives (state on 31 December 2004)






